At our inquiry table we now have a sand tray, Australian animals and Aboriginal symbols on stones. In a circle we examined the stones and discussed their meaning. We also talked about the different ways that Aboriginal people tell stories and that stories from the 'dreaming' have been told over hundreds of years.

We are learning about how stories can be told in different ways, which nurtures the children's early literacy development. Literacy in early childhood represents multiple forms of communication such as; storytelling, music, the arts, speaking, reading and writing. By focusing on the way aboriginal people tell stories it will also help to develop children's early literacy development.
